- 3. Review grant allocation processes and resource/funding models identify opportunities (Objective 2)
- 4. Scoping and development of a LEMA Knowledge Hub including resource development (Objective 1)
- 5. Embed a LEMA maturity assessment into the process (Objective 1)
- 6. A training gap analysis and development of online training modules to support LG (Objective 1)
- 7. Develop an agreed LEMA Support Pathway guide, identifying support gaps and opportunities (Objective 2)
- 8. Identify and refine other collaboration opportunities i.e. *joint Local EM Arrangements/Committees, opportunities from outcomes of other interconnected projects etc* (Objective 2)
- 9. Identify options for LG resource and register sharing (Objective 2)
- 10. Identify opportunities to embed EM into LG business as usual (Integrated Planning and Reporting) (Objective 2)
